

Traffic control by number plates

In order to control the number of vehicles accessing the Household Waste Recycling Centres, a traffic control system will be in place. This will be based on odd and even number plates and will work on a four week rota to limit the amount of traffic visiting the centres on any one day. The only day that changes each week is a Wednesday.

Number plates ending with odd numbers - one, three, five, seven and nine - will be allowed on the days shown below.

Number plates ending with even numbers - zero, two, four, six and eight - will be allowed on the days shown below.

Starting on Saturday 2nd May with even number plates; below is a table detailing when you will be able to visit based on your vehicle number plate:

Recycling Centre Rules

- Open for bagged general waste only, no recycling accepted
- Only 1 person per vehicle
- Cars and small vans only - No transit type vans and vehicles with trailers
- No pedestrian access

- SUEZ staff will not be able to help unload your vehicle
- Please take proof of address with you such as your council tax bill, gas or electric bill to show you live in one of the 9 councils in Greater Manchester. You can show your bill on your mobile phone.
- ANPR and CCTV are in operation, trade waste is not allowed.
- Please expect to queue for longer than usual due to social distancing restrictions in place. Please make sure you don't block access for other road users
